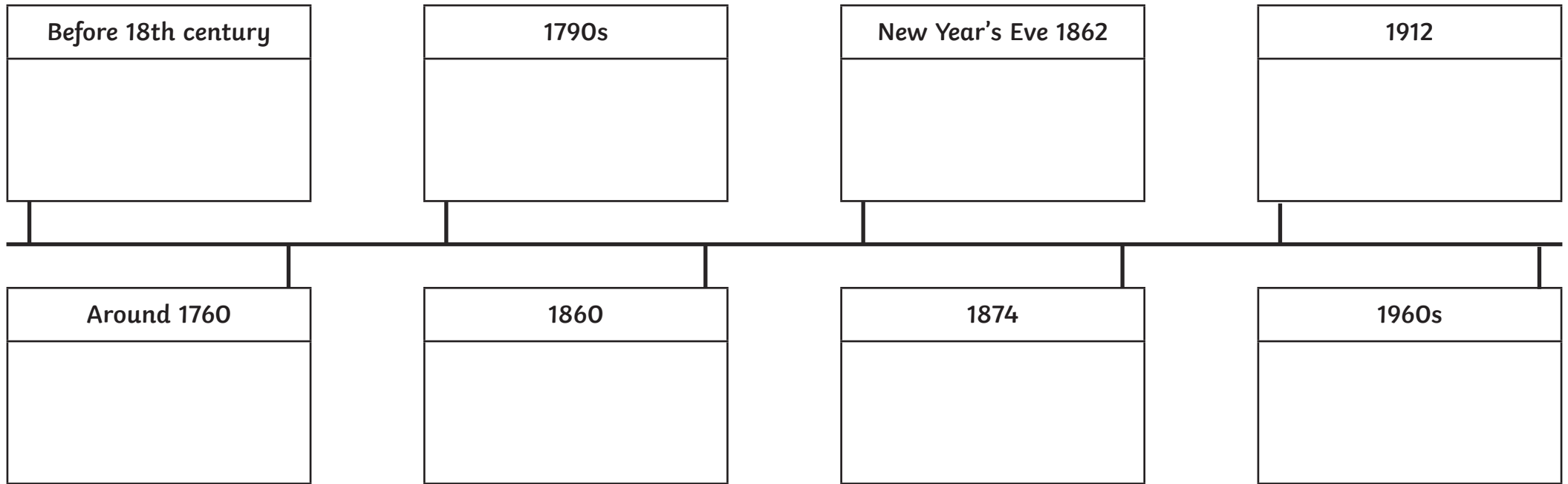


The Lancashire Cotton Industry Timeline Activity

Cut out the events about the Lancashire cotton industry and put them in the right order.

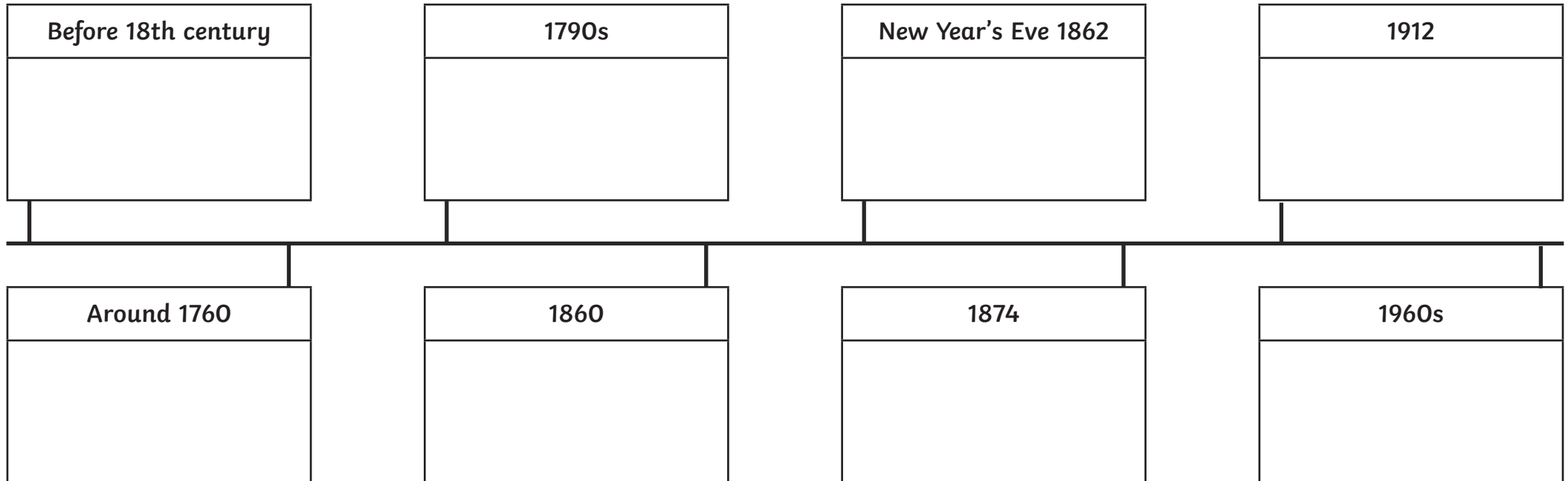
