Basic Crêpes Recipe

Butter or margarine, for frying

Method

- In a large mixing bowl, whick together the flour and the eggs.
- M Gradually add in the milk and water, stirring to combine.
- μ Add the salt and butter; beat until smooth
- ۶ Heat a non-stick frying pan over medium high heat and melt butter. Add the batter into the pan, using approximately 1/4 cup for each crepe.
- yn Tilt the pan with a circular motion so that the batter coats the surface evenly
- Cook the crepe for about 2 minutes, until the bottom is light brown.
- Loosen with a spatula, turn and cook the other side. Serve hot.


225g lean braising steak ½ onion 50g swede 1 small potato, peeled and diced Black pepper 2 x 10ml spoon water 400g shortcrust pastry 1 egg, beaten.

measuring spoons, large bowl, spoon, flour dredger, rolling pin, small side plate, small bowl, fork, fish slice, pastry brush, oven gloves, baking tray.




- 1. Preheat the oven to 180°C or gas mark 4.
- Prepare the filling ingredients:
 - dice the meat;
 - peel and chop the onion;
 - peel and chop the swede.
- Put the meat, potato, onion, swede and water into the small bowl. Season with a few twists of black pepper.
- Mix everything together.
- Divide the pastry into four.
- Take one piece of the pastry and, on a lightly floured surface, roll it out. Place the small plate on top and cut around the plate to make a circle.
- Place 3 to 4 spoons of filling in the middle of the circle.
- Brush the edges of the pastry with beaten egg.
- Pull up the two opposite sides of pastry and pinch them together all the way along.
- Brush the pastie with a little beaten egg, then transfer it on to a baking tray.
- 11. Repeat this with the remaining pastry and filing.
- Carefully, place the baking tray into the hot oven wearing oven gloves.
- 13. Bake the pasties for one hour.
- Wearing oven gloves, remove the pasties from the oven. Place onto a cooling rack.




- Use a different chopping board and knife to cut the meat and vegetables.








Print Your Own Engine House to cut out and colour

Use colour pens or crayons to colour your Engine House to Cut Out and Colour Use colour pens or crayons to colour your Engine House, then cut out all parts. Score and fold all the tabs and fold the walls together. To keep the engine house together for now, glue the little tab (1) to the top of the other wall. To roll the chimney, use a tube or dowel piece, about 13mm diameter. Roll the chimney round, making it into a taper. Glue along the strip and fix together. This can be tricky. Once dry, apply some glue to the angled tabs on the corners of the engine house and fix the chimney into the corner, making sure it fits tightly. This will fix all of the walls together. Cut a small corner of the roof where the chimney is and then glue the roof to the top. Once you have done this, your Engine House is finshed!



Cut out and fold the cage body (3), the top and bottom of the cage (4&5) and glue or sellotape together. Cut out the cage strips (6) and fix to the front of the cage. Slide the cage up inside the shaft. Glue or sellotape the shaft bottom and make sure that the cage
