What a wonderful beginning to the year we have had. It's been fantastic to welcome lots of new families to Becket this term.

Year 2 school trip – Year 2 were lucky enough to get the chance to travel to Hutton Primary school to take part in a geography day. The year 2 children from Hutton taught us all about their twinned town called Dabaso which is in Kenya. We really enjoyed an African drumming workshop, we discussed the climate in Africa and learnt what it is like to live there, by asking questions of the staff who visited Dabaso last year and looking at lots of photographs. We found out how the children in Dabaso recycle all materials, and how they use some to make footballs. We learnt a rain dance – and it worked – it made it rain!

Year R Teddy Bears Picnic – Thank you to all the Receptions parents that came and enjoyed an afternoon Teddy Bears picnic with their child. During the week the children wrote their own invitations, and on the morning of the picnic the children decorated their biscuits and made their teddy bear sandwich. Benefits – School will receive extra funding if you are claiming certain benefits, therefore it is really important that you apply for Free School Meals, even if your child is in Year R, 1 or 2 and you receive Universal Free School Meals. If you are entitled your, child will continue to receive free school meals Year 3, 4, 5 and 6. Remember School meals are free to all children in Reception, Year 1 and 2.

Lateness and early Pick up - Last year a small number of parents were requesting to pick up their children early, and some children were coming in late every morning. Every minute of the school day is essential and picking your child up early or arriving late on a regular basis, is not only unsettling for your child it causes disruption in class and children miss vital learning time. The Educational Welfare Officer monitors this on a termly basis, this year's target is that all children achieve 95% attendance or over

Inhalers

If your child uses an inhaler, please make sure that it is labelled with their name. Either on the can inside the inhaler or in an inhaler box.

Medication

We can only give medication that has been prescribed by a doctor and with the correct box and labelling. Permission letters can be signed at the school office.

PE kits - In Term 2 we are continuing to ask children to come to school on PE days wearing their PE kits. (White round neck T-shirt or tie dye t-shirt, black shorts, leggings or joggers, daps or trainers and red school jumper or cardigan.) If your child is wearing incorrect PE kit, i.e. tracksuit or where children are wearing inappropriate clothing or footwear and it is deemed not to be safe, children will not be able to participate. We will ring you to ask you to provide the correct clothing.


Poppy's on sale - We will once again be selling poppy's this year. If you would like your child to purchase a poppy please bring in at least 50p.

Year 5 Mini Police update

Mini Police - Year 5 have been taking part in the mini police programme each week. They have shown great enthusiasm and maturity, and we have had excellent feedback so far from the PCSO's. Throughout the programme the children will be completing some first aid training, they will learn to recognise the dangers of water, road safety and how to be safe online. At the end of the 9 weeks an assembly will be held for parents and a PC will be invited to deliver certificates to the children who have passed.





The children have now completed their first three sessions of mini police. Within these sessions the children have looked at the roles within the police system, age of criminal responsibility and hate crimes. Keep up the hard work Year 5, you have been fantastic role models.

Is my child too ill for school?

It can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school, nursery or playgroup when they're unwell. There are government guidelines for schools and nurseries about <u>managing specific infectious</u> <u>diseases at GOV.UK</u>. These say when children should be kept off school and when they shouldn't.

If you do keep your child at home, it's important to phone the school or nursery on the first day. Let them know that your child won't be in and give them the reason.

If your child is well enough to go to school but has an infection that could be passed on, such as a cold

It your child is well enough to go to school but has an intection that could be passed on, such as a cold sore or head lice, let their teacher know.

Other illnesses

Follow this advice for other illnesses:

Coughs and colds

It's fine to send your child to school with a minor <u>cough</u> or <u>common cold</u>. But if they have a fever, keep them off school until the fever goes. Encourage your child to throw away any used tissues and to wash their hands regularly.

High temperature

If your child has a high temperature, keep them off school until it goes away.

Chickenpox

If your child has <u>chickenpox</u>, keep them off school until all the spots have crusted over. This is usually about 5 days after the spots first appeared.

Cold sores

There's no need to keep your child off school if they have a <u>cold sore</u>. Encourage them not to touch the blister or kiss anyone while they have the cold sore, or to share things like cups and towels.

Conjunctivitis

You don't need to keep your child away from school if they have <u>conjunctivitis</u>. Do get advice from your pharmacist. Encourage your child not to rub their eyes and to wash their hands regularly.

COVID-19

If your child has mild symptoms, such as a runny nose, sore throat, or slight cough, and feels well enough, they can go to school. Your child should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people if they have <u>symptoms of COVID-19</u> and they either:

- have a high temperature
- do not feel well enough to go to school or do their normal activities

Ear infection

If your child has an <u>ear infection</u> and a high temperature or severe earache, keep them off school until they're feeling better or their high temperature goes away.

Hand, foot and mouth disease

If your child has <u>hand, foot and mouth disease</u> but seems well enough to go to school, there's no need to keep them off. Encourage your child to throw away any used tissues straight away and to wash their hands regularly.

Head lice and nits

There's no need to keep your child off school if they have head lice. You can treat <u>head lice and nits</u> without seeing a GP.

Impetigo

If your child has <u>impetigo</u>, they'll need treatment from a GP, often with antibiotics. Keep them off school until all the sores have crusted over and healed, or for 48 hours after they start antibiotic treatment. Encourage your child to wash their hands regularly and not to share things like towels and cups with other children at school

Ringworm

If your child has <u>ringworm</u>, see your pharmacist unless it's on their scalp, in which case you should see a GP. It's fine for your child to go to school once they have started treatment.

Scarlet fever

If your child has <u>scarlet fever</u>, they'll need treatment with antibiotics from a GP. Otherwise they'll be infectious for 2 to 3 weeks.

Your child can go back to school 24 hours after starting antibiotics.

Slapped cheek syndrome (fifth disease)

You don't need to keep your child off school if they have <u>slapped cheek syndrome</u> because, once the rash appears, they're no longer infectious.

But let the school or teacher know if you think your child has slapped cheek syndrome.

Sore throat

You can still send your child to school if they have a <u>sore throat</u>. But if they also have a high temperature, they should stay at home until it goes away.

A sore throat and a high temperature can be symptoms of tonsillitis.

Threadworms

You don't need to keep your child off school if they have threadworms.

Speak to your pharmacist, who can recommend a treatment.

Vomiting and diarrhoea

Children with diarrhoea or vomiting should stay away from school until they have not been sick or had diarrhoea for at least 2 days (48 hours).

Polite reminders and useful information:

- Reminder: Children are parent's responsibility from the time we hand over at the end of the day.
- Please ensure you park safely and respectfully when dropping off or picking up children.
- Please make sure all clothing and coats are named.
- Please note that no persons under the age of 16 may collect children at the end of the day.
- Please remember that Becket School has a no nuts policy.
- Please do not allow children to play in the pre-school area afterschool. This area is for pre-school only.
- All children in Reception, year 1 and Year 2 are entitled to a free school meal as part of the Universal Free School Meal campaign.
