
Geography Term 1 and 2 Knowledge Organiser



Key vocabulary

Country - a geographical area that has its own government. **Continent -** a large landmass usually made up of many countries. **Latitude -** geographical coordinates that specifies north south position on the earth's surface (divides into climate zones).

0° = the **Equator**

90°N = the North Pole

90°S = the South Pole

Longitude - geographical coordinates that specifies east west position on the earth's surface (defines date and time).

0° = Greenwich Meridian (or prime meridian) lies in Greenwich, London.

Hemisphere - half of the earth, divided into the northern and southern hemispheres by the Equator, and western and eastern hemispheres by the Greenwich Meridian Line.


Weather - short term changes in the atmosphere.

Atmosphere - the layer of gas that surrounds Earth.

Climate - describes the average weather over a long period of time in a specific area.

Climate zone - areas with distinct climates which occur in an eastwest direction around the earth.

Biome - a large geographical area that has a certain climate and certain types of living things. Major biomes include forests, deserts and grasslands.
