They can also read to you, you can read to them. Enjoy books together.



Asking questions about the book will help children's understanding and comprehension of a book hugely. Please see attached questions to help you.

Phonics

There is a statutory Phonics Test which takes place in June. The children have to read 40 words in total. These are made up of 20 real words and 20 alien words (made-up words). They can comprise of words with:

- Single sounds: c-a-t (consonant-vowel-consonant).
- Digraphs (2 letters making one sound – ‘ai’ being the digraph) p-ai-n.
- Trigraphs (3 letters making one sound – ‘igh’ being the trigraph) h-igh.



How can I help my child at home?

English

- By reading 5 times a week. This can be a school book, a book from home or a library book.
- By practicing key words.
- Learning to read and spell the Year 1 common exception words.



Maths

- To help your child learn their number bonds to 10 (two numbers that add up to make 10, two numbers that add up to make 9, two numbers that add up to make 8 and so on 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1) e.g. $5 + 4 = 9$, $3 + 3 = 6$.
- Helping your child learn to count forwards and backwards in steps of one from 0 to 100.
- Practice counting in steps of 2, 5 and 10.
