

A typical day in Reception - Term 1

- 8.35am School day starts. Children self-register and choose learning
- 9am Whole class session
- 9.30am Child-led learning inside/outside or adult-led small group activity
- 10.30am Whole class session
- 11.30am Story and songs
- 12pm Lunch in the hall followed by playtime outside
- 1pm Register and whole class session
- 1.30pm Child-led learning inside/outside or adult-led small group activity
- 2.50pm Story and songs before getting ready for home time
- 3.10pm Home time

Every child is a unique child, who is constantly learning and who can be resilient, capable, confident and self-assured.

EYFS Statutory Framework

with teaching and support from adults, who respond to their individual interests and needs and help them to build their learning over time.

(Recognise the) importance of learning and development.

Children develop and learn at different rates.

EYFS Statutory Framework

The characteristics of effective teaching and learning

In planning and guiding what children learn, practitioners must reflect on the different rates at which children are developing and adjust their practice appropriately. Three characteristics of effective teaching and learning are:

- playing and exploring children investigate and experience things, and 'have a go'
- active learning children concentrate and keep on trying if they encounter difficulties, and enjoy achievements
- creating and thinking critically children have and develop their own ideas, make links between ideas, and develop strategies for doing things
