**Dinners** - We would like to remind you that even if your child is entitled to Universal Free School Meals or in KS2 and entitled to Free Schools Meals **you must still book your child's meal** using the Aspens system. We have an increasing number of children expecting a school dinner when one has not been booked, Aspens staff cook meals to order and whilst it is always possible to allow for one or two discrepancies it is not manageable when expected numbers differ significantly. For example 18 meals were not pre ordered on Tuesday of this week.

Mendip Outdoor Pursuits - Year 3, 4, 5 and 6 have really enjoyed their days at Mendip Outdoor Pursuits this week. Year 3 had a great time at Mendip Outdoor Activity Centre on Wednesday. We enjoyed tobogganing and practised our throwing skills during Frisbee golf. The children were fantastic and had a brilliant time. Year 4 started with a walk through the woods and really enjoyed the low ropes. Year 4 worked in teams to 'spot' each other on the equipment. This meant we were ready to help if a friend wobbled or needed support. After we all had a go climbing and balancing our way around the course, we then tried some of the equipment blindfolded or holding a full cup of water which meant we had to do it one handed! This really tested our balance and team work and was a lot of fun. After lunch, we made shelters and tested them to see if they were wind, bear and waterproof! Then, we had a go at making small fires using flint and steel. It took some perseverance but we all managed to do it. The children were super all day, showing bravery, perseverance and great team work in all they did. We were very proud of them all. Year 5 had a wonderful day caving and climbing on Tuesday. They were all fantastic and everybody rose to the challenge of entering the caves; climbing the walls and working as a group to belay each other. They all demonstrated courage, perseverance and a wonderful team spirit. It was brilliant watching everybody being so supportive towards each other. We are so proud of you Year 5 – well done! Year 6 had an amazing day on Thursday, working cooperatively on the low ropes. In the afternoon we played Archery Active – where we got to play combative archery- it was great fun.
