Remember that when we spell sight words we use the letter names and not the sounds the letters make.</p>	<p>Use your phase 3 and 4 phoneme cards and sight words to see how quickly you can read them. Use a timer from a phone or an Ipad to time yourselves. Record your time and see if your beat it.</p> <p>Play 'Make a Match' using sh, th and ch on phonics play. https://www.phonicsplay.co.uk/member-only/MatchingPh3Wk3.html</p> <p>Spellings Please could the adults read out phase 2 and 3 sight words and the children then write them down. Make a list of the ones that they need more practise on and then use these for the games today and tomorrow.</p> <p>Bingo Play bingo using sight words. You could use a 2x3 grid and encourage the children to write six sight words on the grid. Take it in turns to be the caller and the first person to match all six sight words shouts 'bingo'. Then play Tricky trucks games on phase 2 and 3 tricky words.</p> <p>Play 'Make a Match' using ai, ee and igh on phonics play. https://www.phonicsplay.co.uk/member-only/MatchingPh3Wk4.html</p> <p>Noughts and Crosses Play noughts and crosses but choose two sight words to write in the grids. Repeat with two different sight words</p> <p>Quick write Choose one sight word and write it as many times as you can in one minute. Repeat and see if you can beat your score. Use different sight words.</p>	<p>Use your phase 3 and 4 phoneme cards and sight words to see how quickly you can read them. Use a timer from a phone or an Ipad to time yourselves. Were you quicker than before? How much quicker?</p> <p>Play 'Make a Match' using oa, oo and ar on phonics play. https://www.phonicsplay.co.uk/member-only/MatchingPh3Wk5.html</p> <p>Writing Adults, please could you read these sentences and get the children to write them. Check the spelling of the sight words and encourage them to use their sounds for the other.</p> <p>There comes a rumbling sound.</p> <p>To find me some treasure in the mud.</p> <p>Encourage the children to make to write their own sentences.</p>	<p>Can you go on a minibeast hunt in your garden? What can you see? Can you record which minibeasts you saw?</p> <p>If you don't have a garden then look for some when you go out for a walk.</p>
