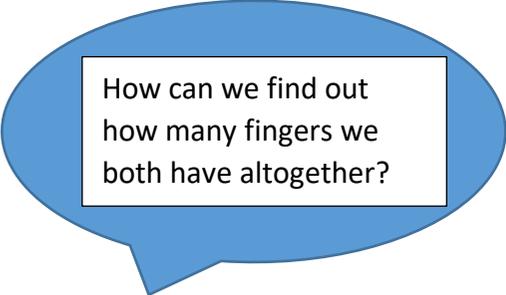




You can google your own songs or use these examples, Days of the week - https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=0CuphkWcdDE Months of the year - https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=3S5c2ukWVFo</p> <p>What do you do at home on certain days of the week, can you make a weekly timetable with your child, e.g. on Thursday we clap for carers.</p> <p>White Rose Day 1 https://wrm-13b48.kxcdn.com/wp-content/uploads/2020/06/Day-1-The-Princess-and-the-Wizard.pdf</p>	<p>Throwing and catching counting Using a ball try to throw and catch with your child 10 times. Can you think of a little prize if you make it to 10, you could have a big hug! Record how many times you manage to throw and catch without dropping the ball. What was your highest score, what was your lowest score. Do any of your scores added together make 10? If you make it to 10 could you challenge yourself to make it to 20 throws and catches without dropping the ball?</p> <p>White Rose Day 2 https://wrm-13b48.kxcdn.com/wp-content/uploads/2020/06/Day-2-The-Princess-and-the-Wizard.pdf</p>	<p>Making sandwiches for lunch Encourage your child to make the sandwiches for lunch, can they work out how much butter they will need to cover the bread, can they spread it right to the edges? Can they spread the filling or put the right amount of cheese on the bread to cover it? Can they cut the sandwich in half and then in quarters? Can they cut triangles and squares? Can they cut some fruit or vegetables in half and quarters to share for lunch? Maybe they could share out a packet of crisps. Remember when cutting in half and quarters the pieces need to be the same size!</p> <p>White Rose Day 3 https://wrm-13b48.kxcdn.com/wp-content/uploads/2020/06/Day-3-The-Princess-and-the-Wizard.pdf</p>	<p>Count down hide and seek Play hide and seek with your child, but instead of counting up to 20 can you and your child count down from 20 to 0 and when you get to 0 you can go and seek!</p> <p>Is there another game you can play where you can count down from 20 to 0?</p> <p>Maybe you could count backwards as you walk down the stairs, or count backwards as you carefully walk around the house. Count backwards and see how far you can get from one part of the house to another.</p> <p>White Rose Day 4 https://wrm-13b48.kxcdn.com/wp-content/uploads/2020/06/Day-4-The-Princess-and-the-Wizard.pdf</p>	<p>Make a symmetrical pattern with 20 different things on it. Draw half a butterfly on a folded piece of newspaper and cut it out. You put an object or draw a shape on one side and ask your child to copy it on the other side. Try to count the objects you draw each time and tell your child you will stop when you get to 20. Look at the pattern, explain that you have made a symmetrical pattern, it is the same on both sides.</p> <p>You could count the objects in 2s. Open ended questions and enabling statements about calculating.


During the day talk about what you are doing and see if you can include these questions and statements.



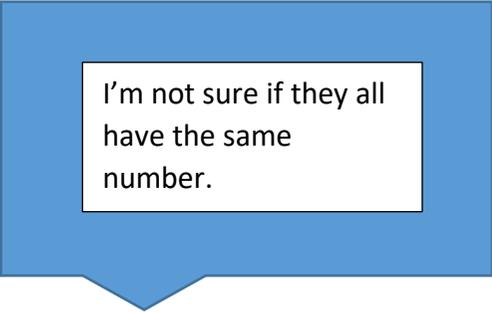
How can we find out how many fingers we both have altogether?




I wonder what the best way to share out all the biscuits is?




It looks like there might be 20 altogether – what do you think?
