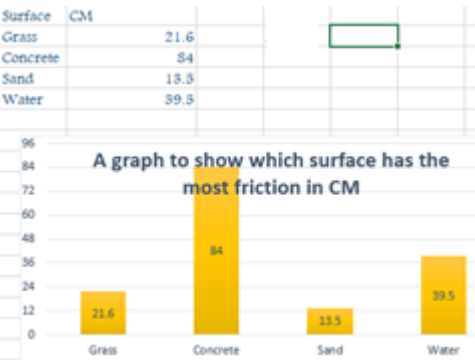
In school learning - Computing

Before the school closure this academic year, the children in Becket had already used computing in a variety of ways.

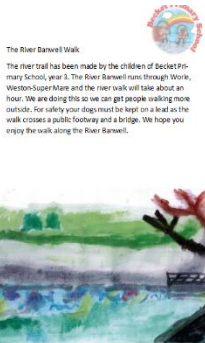
Key Stage 1 used Beebots to learn about algorithms and programming. They also created digital art used 2Paint a Picture.

Lower Key Stage 2 created leaflets about River Banwell using Publisher, created graphs from data in Excel and designed posters on Word.

Upper Key Stage 2 created leaflets about Walking to school using Publisher, created maps and graphs from data in Excel and devised presentations using PowerPoint.



- Directions to the river
- Start at the entrance of the footpath by Warsborough Road that runs by Priory Community School.
 - Walk south-east until you reach a turning, you will see Priory's play fields on your left.
 - Head north-east and continue going straight ahead until you reach a turning.

Introduction

Park and Stride.
So what can we do to convince Becket pupils to walk to school? Some pupils from Becket Primary School live up to 3 miles away but Becket children have found a way to make people walk instead of driving: it is called Park and Stride. It means that you can park away from the school (for e.g. Salisbury's) and walk the rest of the way. Some of the problems with walking to school are that there is too much traffic near the school. Which makes it dangerous.



Underpass.
78% of children walk but 13% drive to Becket. Near the underpasses it can be dangerous walking home in the twilight. It can also be scary to walk home in the twilight because the lights flicker especially the closest one to Priory. Sometimes pathways are dangerous because there are hedges that are over grown (e.g. Queensway)
